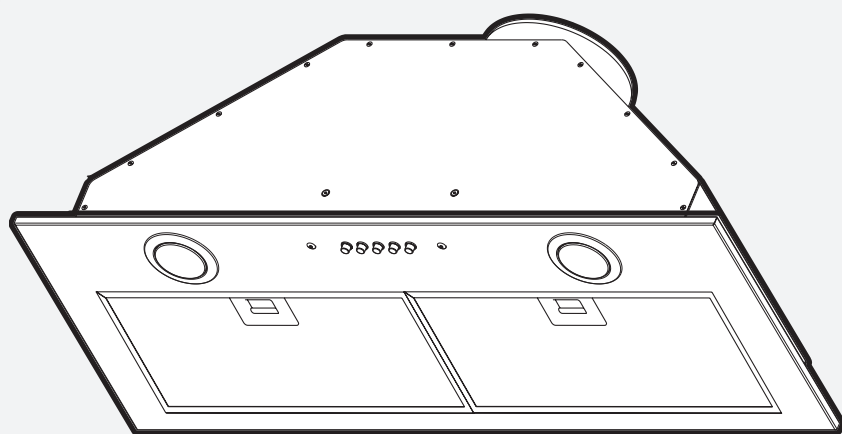

- A. Do not operate any fan with a damaged cord or plug. Discard fan or return to an authorized service facility for examination and/or repair.
- B. Do not run cord under carpeting. Do not cover cord with throw rugs, runners, or similar coverings. Do not route cord under furniture or appliances. Arrange cord away from traffic area and where it will not be tripped over.

- c) Clean ventilating fans frequently. Grease should not be allowed to accumulate on fan or filter.
- d) Use proper pan size. Always use cookware appropriate for the size of the surface element.

Location requirements:

IMPORTANT: Observe all governing codes and ordinances. Have a qualified technician install the range hood. It is the installer's responsibility to comply with installation clearances specified on the model/serial rating plate. The model/serial rating plate is located inside the liner behind the filter on the left wall of the range hood.

Range hood location should be away from strong draft areas, such as windows, doors, and strong heating vents.

Cabinet opening dimensions that are shown must be used. Given dimensions provide minimum clearance. Consult your cooktop/ range manufacturer installation instructions before making any cutouts.

This range hood is recommended for use with cooktops with a maximum total rating of 65,000 BTUs or less.

Grounded electrical outlet is required. See "Electrical Requirements" section.

The range hood is factory set for vented installations through the roof or wall. For non-vented (recirculating) installations see "Non- Vented (recirculating) Installation Through the Soffit/Cabinet" in the "Prepare Location" section.

Recirculation Kit Part is available from your dealer or an authorized parts distributor. All openings in ceiling and wall where range hood will be installed must be sealed.

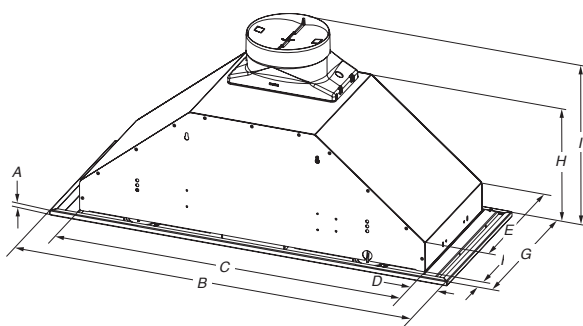
For mobile home installations

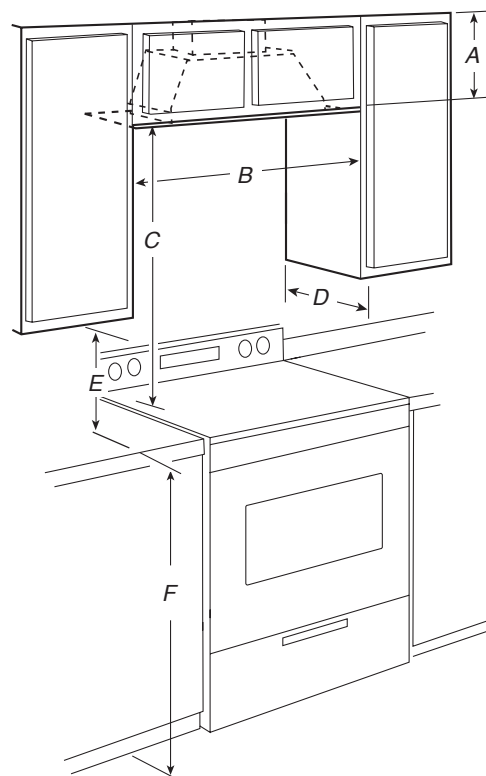

For gas and electric ranges installation: Mount this hood so that the bottom edge is at minimum 30" (76.2 cm) above the cooking surface.

Installation clearances



- A. 12" (30.5 cm) min. upper cabinet height
- B. 30" (76.2 cm) or 36" (91.4 cm) cabinet opening width*
- C. 24" (61.0 cm) min. from electric cooking surface, 27" (68.6 cm) min. from gas cooking surface, 36" (91.4 cm) suggested max. bottom of cabinet to cooking surface
- D. 12" (30.48 cm) cabinet opening depth*
- E. 15" (38.1 cm) min. clearance upper cabinet to countertop
- F. 36" (91.4 cm) base cabinet height

***NOTE:** 30" (76.2 cm) cabinet width can be 12" (30.5 cm) deep or 18" (45.7 cm) deep cabinets. 36" (91.4 cm) cabinet width requires 18" (45.7 cm) deep cabinets. For 18" (45.7 cm) deep cabinets, an optional Face Panel Rear Extension (30" [76.2 cm]) must be purchased separately. See the "Available accessories" section to order.

Venting requirements

- Vent system must terminate to the outdoors, except for no vented (recirculating) installations.
- Do not terminate the vent system in an attic or other enclosed area.
- Do not use a 4" (10.2 cm) laundry-type wall cap.
- Rigid metal vent is recommended. Plastic or metal foil vent is not recommended. The length of vent system and number of elbows should be kept to a minimum to provide efficient performance.

For the most efficient and quiet operation:

- Use no more than three 90° elbows.
- Make sure there is a minimum of 24" (61 cm) of straight vent between the elbows if more than 1 elbow is used.
- Do not install 2 elbows together.
- Use clamps to seal all joints in the vent system.
- The vent system must have a damper.
- Use caulking to seal exterior wall or roof opening around the cap.
- The size of the vent should be uniform.

Cold weather installations

An additional back draft damper non return valve should be installed to minimize backward cold air flow and a thermal break should be installed to minimize conduction of outside temperatures as part of the vent system. The damper non return valve should be on the cold air side of the thermal break.

The break should be as close as possible to where the vent system enters the heated portion of the house.

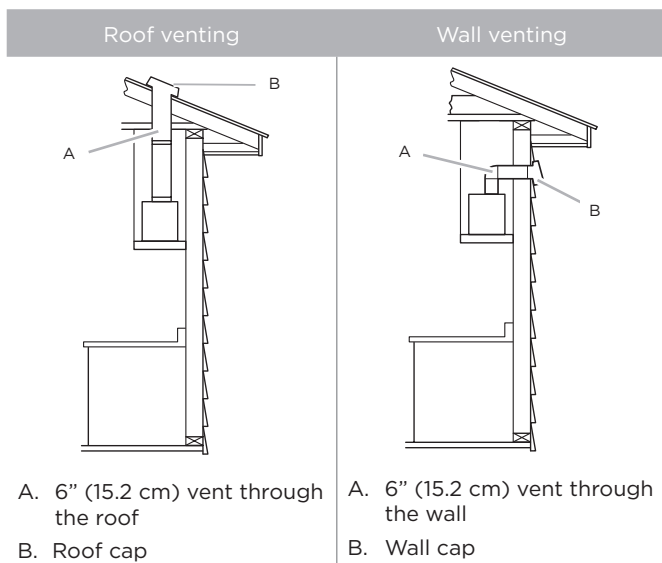
Makeup air

Local building codes may require the use of makeup air systems when using ventilation systems with greater than specified CFM of air movement. The specified CFM varies from locale to locale. Consult your HVAC professional for specific requirements in your area.

Venting methods

This range hood is factory set for venting through the roof or through the wall. You can apply the recirculating venting method by purchasing the Recirculation Kit. The vent system needed for installation is not included.

A 6" (15.2 cm) round vent system is recommended.



Calculate Vent System Length

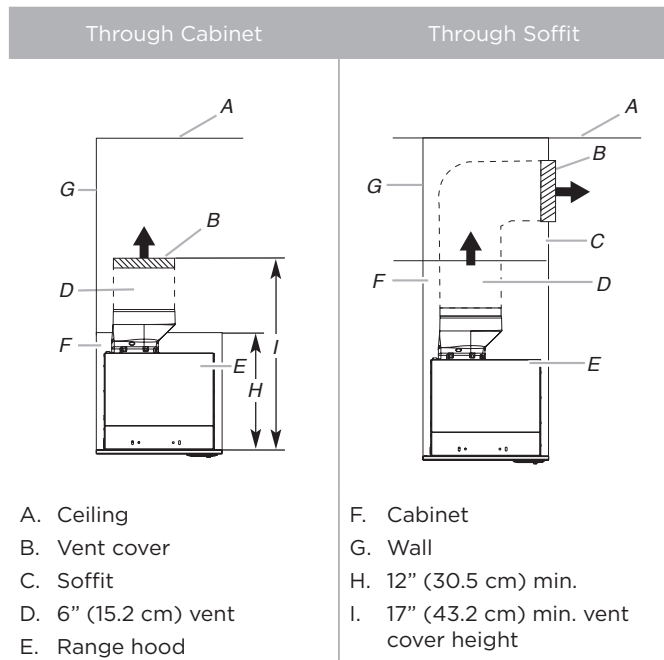
The recommended vent system is 6" (15.2 cm) round vent with a maximum length of 35 ft (10.7 m). For the best performance, use no more than three 90° elbows.

To calculate the length of the system, add the equivalent feet (meters) for each of the vent pieces used in the system.

Vent piece	6" (15.2 cm)	
45° elbow	2.5 ft (0.8 m)	
90° elbow	5.0 ft (1.5 m)	

Non-Vented (recirculating) Installations Through the Soffit/Cabinet

If it is not possible to vent cooking fumes and vapors to the outside, the range hood can be used in the non-vented (recirculating) version, using a charcoal filter. Recirculation Kit is available from the dealer or an authorized parts distributor.

***NOTE:** 12" (30.5 cm) high cabinets without soffit may allow the 6" (15.2 cm) vent and vent cover to be seen.

Electrical requirements

IMPORTANT: The range hood must be electrically grounded in accordance with local codes and ordinances, or in the absence of local codes, with the National Electrical Code, ANSI/NFPA 70 (latest edition) or Canadian Electrical Code, CSA C22.1 No. 0-M91 (latest edition).

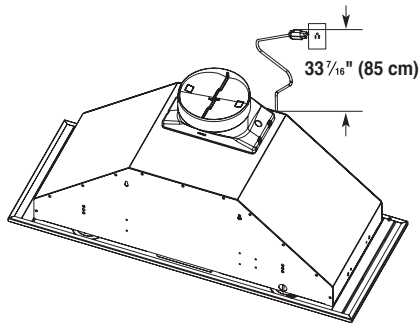
If codes permit and a separate ground wire is used, it is recommended that a qualified electrical installer determine that the ground path is adequate.

- A 120 volt, 60 Hz, AC only, 15- or 20-amp, fused electrical circuit is required. A time-delay fuse or circuit breaker is also recommended. It is recommended that a separate circuit serving only this range hood be provided.
- This range hood is equipped with a power supply cord having a 3 prong grounding plug.
- To minimize possible shock hazard, the cord must be plugged into a mating, 3 prong, grounding-type outlet, grounded in accordance with local codes and ordinances. If a mating outlet is not available, it is the personal responsibility and obligation of the customer to have the properly grounded outlet installed by a qualified electrician.

- The grounded 3 prong outlet is to be located inside the cabinet above the range hood at a maximum distance of 33³/₁₆" (85.0 cm) from where the power cord exits the hood. The grounded 3 prong outlet must be accessible after installation of the range hood. See illustration:



GROUNDING INSTRUCTIONS

- This range hood must be grounded. In the event of an electrical short circuit, grounding reduces the risk of electric shock by providing an escape wire for the electric current.
- This range hood is equipped with a cord having a grounding wire with a grounding plug. The plug must be plugged into an outlet that is properly installed and grounded.

WARNING: Improper grounding can result in a risk of electric shock.

Consult a qualified electrician if the grounding instructions are not completely understood, or if doubt exists as to whether the range hood is properly grounded.

Do not use an extension cord. If the power supply cord is too short, have a qualified electrician install an outlet near the range hood.

Installation instructions

Prepare location

- It is recommended that the vent system be installed before the range hood is installed.
 - Before making cutouts, make sure there is proper clearance within the ceiling or wall for vent fittings.
 - Making the cutout to the bottom of the cabinet may be easier to do prior to mounting the cabinet to the wall.
- 1 Disconnect power.
 - 2 Determine which venting method to use: roof, wall, or non vented.
 - 3 Select a flat surface for assembling the range hood. Place covering over that surface.

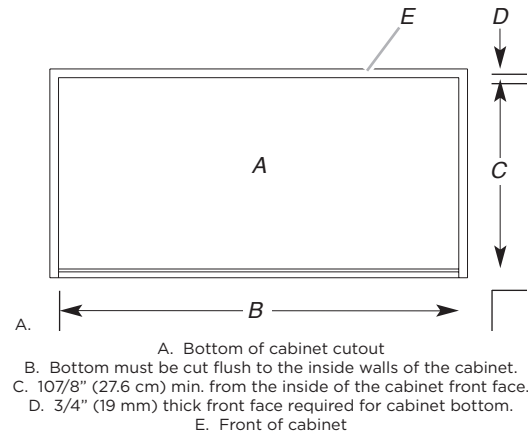
- 4 Using 2 or more people, lift range hood onto covered surface.

Range hood cabinet cutout

- 1 Use a saber saw or keyhole saw to cut out the cabinet bottom inside the cabinet frame.

***NOTE:** Frameless type cabinets require 3/4" (1.9 cm) front lip in the cabinet bottom. A 3/4" (1.9 cm) thick filler strip (not supplied) may be required for some types of cabinets. (See Step 3 in the "Install Range Hood" section).

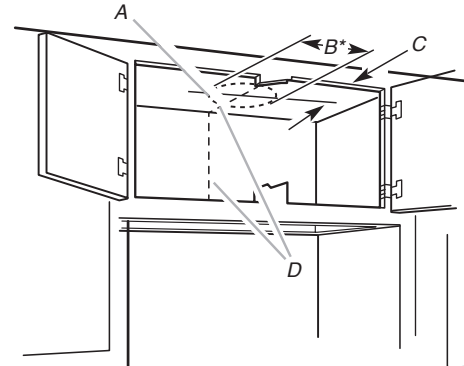
Cut out dimensions (without spacers)



- 2 Complete cabinet preparation following the instruction for your type of venting. Determine venting cutout locations and cut out vent openings in the cabinets, walls and or soffit.

Venting outside through the roof

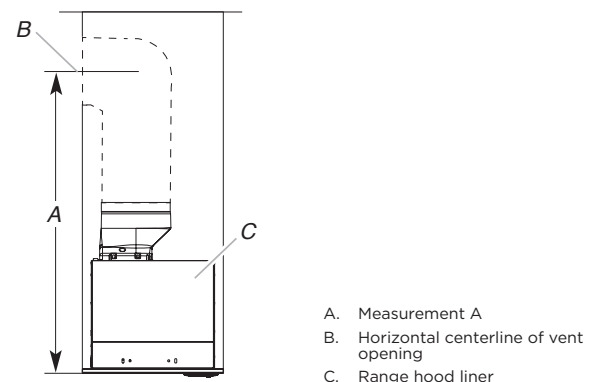
- 1 Measure and mark the lines as shown. Use a saber saw or keyhole saw to cut an opening through the top of the cabinet and the roof for the vent.



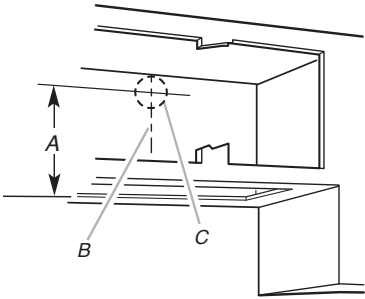
***NOTE:** For 12" (30.5 cm) high cabinets, a 6 1/4" deep x 8" wide (14.6 cm x 20.3 cm) rectangular opening in the cabinet top is required for damper transition clearance.

Venting outside through the wall

- 1 Install the 6" (15.2 cm) vent transition to the top of the range hood liner using two 3.5 x 9.5 mm screws. Assemble the vent duct that you will use over the 6" (15.2 cm) vent transition. Measure from the bottom of the range hood liner to the horizontal centerline of the vent opening (A).



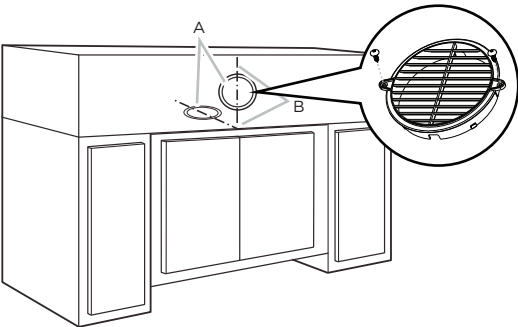
- Remove the vent duct from the range hood liner. Transfer measurement A to the cabinet back wall. Measure from the underside of the cabinet.
- Mark the cutout as shown. Use a saber saw or keyhole saw to cut a round opening through the back of the cabinet and the exterior wall for the vent.

C. 6 1/4" (15.9 cm) round cutout

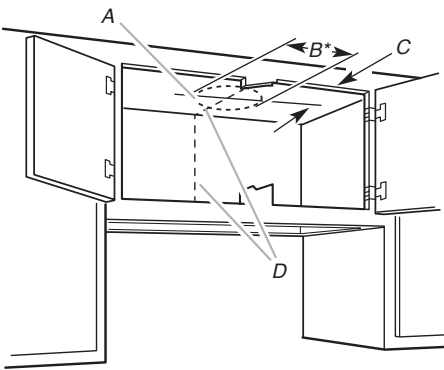
Non-vented (recirculating) installation through the soffit/cabinet

- Measure and mark the centerline of the cabinet to the soffit above.
- Measure from the bottom of the cabinet to the centerline of the where the vent will come through the soffit. Mark the location and use a saber saw or keyhole saw to cut a 5 3/4" (14.6 cm) hole for the vent cover.

- Measure and mark the centerline location for the cutout in the cabinet top. Use a saber saw or keyhole saw to cut an opening for the vent.

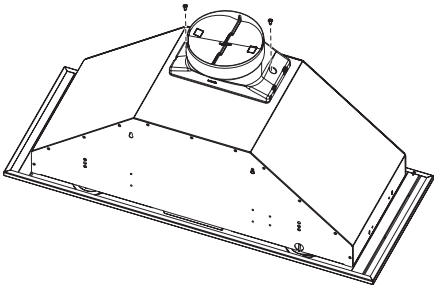


A. Cutout

For non-vented (recirculating) installations only, the range hood can be vented indoors through the top of the cabinet. See the "Available Accessories" section for Recirculation Kit.

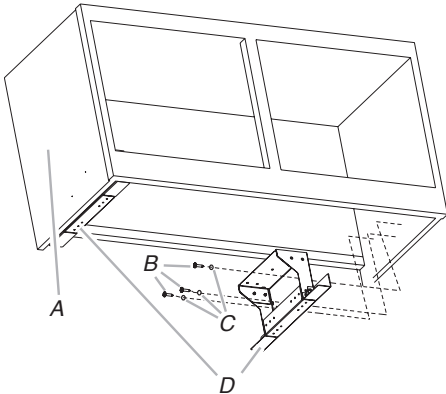
Complete preparation

- If not yet attached, install the 6" (15.2 cm) vent transition the top of the range hood liner using two 3.5 x 9.5 mm screws.



- Locate side mounting bracket flush 1 cm to the bottom of the cabinet side and against the inside of the front cabinet face. Drill 1/8" (3 mm) pilot holes in 6 places, attach a bracket using three 4.5 x 13 mm screws to each side of the cabinet, and tighten. Additional washers in hardware package are supplied as spacers for cabinet walls thinner than 1/2" (13 mm).

- Install the vent system according to the method needed. Use caulking to seal the exterior wall or roof opening.

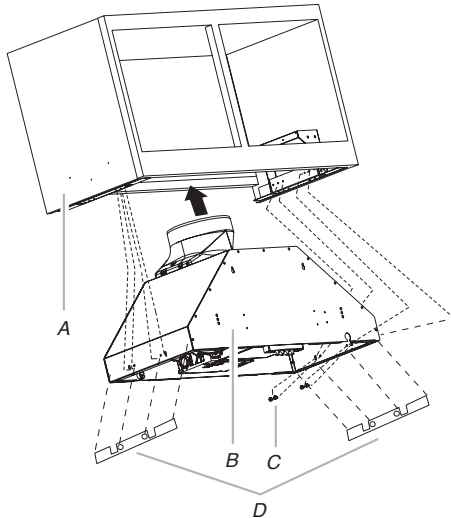

12" (30.5 cm)	A 6 1/4" deep x 8" wide (15.9 cm x 20.3 cm) rectangular opening in the cabinet top is required for damper transition clearance.
15" (38.1 cm) cabinet or soffit installation	A 6 1/4" (15.9 cm) diameter round opening is required
18" (45.7 cm) or 24" (61.0)	A 5 3/4" (14.6 cm) diameter round opening is required.

Install range hood

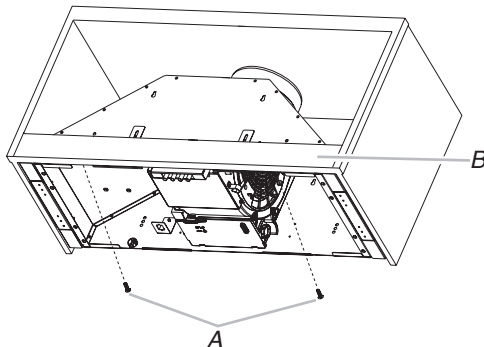

- 1 Using 2 or more people, lift the hood liner into its mount location. Attach with four 4.2 x 19 mm screws into the slotted openings. Do not tighten screws.



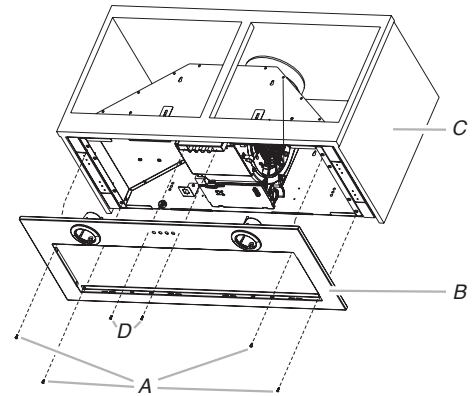
- A. Cabinet
B. Hood liner canopy assembly
C. Screws - 4.2 x 19 mm (8)
D. Spacer (optional)

- 2 If needed, insert spacers between each side of the canopy and the mounting plate to space and center the canopy in the cabinet. Align the bottom of the canopy with the bottom of the cabinet. Install four 4.2 x 19 mm screws into the round mounting plate openings and tighten all eight mounting screws.
- 3 **(For some installations):** A filler strip may be required for some cabinets. Install a filler strip and secure with two 4.5 x 13 mm screws from inside the front of the hood liner assembly.

- 4 Remove the metal grease filters from the face panel.
- 5 Attach the face panel to the hood liner. (Three sizes: The 30" x 12" [76.2 cm x 30.5 cm] cabinet size is shown.) See instruction below for your specific cabinet size.



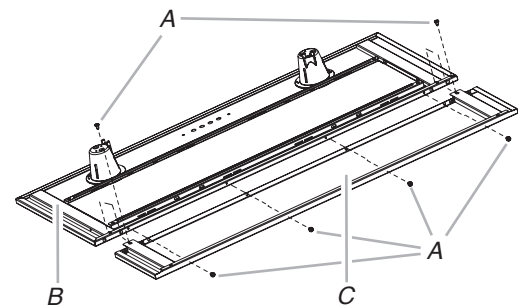
- A. Screws: 3.5 x 9.5 mm flat-head (4)
B. Face plate (30" x 12" [76.2 cm x 30.5 cm] shown)
C. Cabinet (30" x 12" [76.2 cm x 30.5 cm] shown)
D. Screws: 4.2 x 15 mm truss-head (2)

For cabinet size: 30" x 12" (76.2 cm x 30.5 cm)

- 1 Attach the 30" x 12" (76.2 cm x 30.5 cm) face panel (supplied with range hood) to the hood liner using four 3.5 x 9.5 mm flat-head screws and two 4.2 x 15 mm truss head screws. Tighten to secure.
- 2 Connect the lamp electrical connector.

For cabinet size: 30" x 18" (76.2 cm x 45.7 cm)

- 1 Assemble the 30" x 6" (76.2 cm x 15.2 cm) face panel rear extension (see the "Assistance or Service" section to order) to the 30" x 12" (76.2 cm x 30.5 cm) face panel (supplied with the range hood) using eight 4.2 x 8 mm screws (supplied with the face panel rear extension).
- 2 Attach the 30" x 18" (76.2 cm x 45.7 cm) face panel assembly to the hood liner using four 3.5 x 9.5 mm flat-head screws and two 4.2 x 15 mm truss head screws. Tighten to secure.
- 3 Connect the lamp electrical connector.

Connect the vent system

Vented Installations

- 1 Connect the vent system to the range hood vent opening. Seal the connection with clamps.

Non-Vented (recirculating) Installations

- 1 Connect the vent system to the range hood vent opening. Seal the connection with clamps.
- 2 Install charcoal filters. See the "Available accessories" section for Recirculation kit.

Complete installation

- 1 Replace grease filters. See the "Maintenance" section.

- 2 Plug 3-prong power cord into a grounded 3-prong outlet located inside the cabinet above the range hood.
- 3 Check the operation of the range hood fan and light. See "Description of the hood" section. If range hood does not operate, check to see whether a circuit breaker has tripped or a household fuse has blown. Disconnect power and check wiring connections.

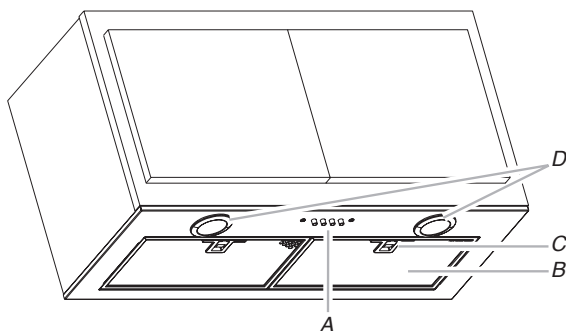
NOTE: To get the most efficient use from your new range hood, read the "Description of the hood" section.

- 4 Install the cabinet doors to the cabinet. Use the assembly instructions that come with the cabinet.

Description of the hood

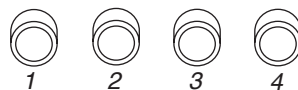
The range hood is designed to remove smoke, cooking vapors and odors from the cooktop area. For best results, start the hood before cooking and allow it to operate several minutes after the cooking is complete to clear all smoke and odors from the kitchen.

The hood controls are located on the center of the front of the range hood liner.



- A. Blower and light controls
- B. Grease filter
- C. Grease filter handle
- D. LED lamps

Controls



1. Light On/Off button
2. Blower On/Off button and speed minimum button
3. Blower speed medium button
4. Blower speed maximum button

Operating the light

The Light On/Off button (1) controls both lights. Press once for On and again for Off.

Operating the blower

The Blower Speed buttons turn the blower on and control the blower speed and sound level for quiet operation. The speed can be changed anytime during fan operation by pressing the desired blower speed button.

Press the Blower Off button a second time to turn off the blower.

Maintenance

Cleaning

Do not spray cleaners directly to the control while cleaning the Hood. The cooker hood should be cleaned regularly (at least with the same frequency with which you carry out maintenance of the fat filters) internally and externally. Do not use abrasive products. Do not use chlorine base cleaners. DO NOT USE ALCOHOL!

To avoid damage to the exterior surface, do not use steel wool or soap-filled scouring pads.

Always wipe dry to avoid water marks.

Cleaning Method:

Liquid detergent soap and water, or all-purpose cleanser. Wipe with damp soft cloth or nonabrasive sponge, then rinse with clean water and wipe dry.

⚠ WARNING

Failure to carry out the basic cleaning recommendations of the cooker hood and replacement of the filters may cause fire risks.

Therefore, we recommend observing these instructions.

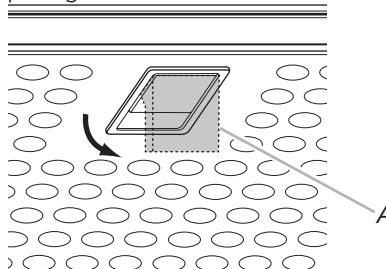

Metal grease filter

The filters should be washed frequently. Place metal filters in dishwasher or hot detergent solution to clean. Let filter dry thoroughly before replacing it.

Turn off fan and lights. Allow lamps to cool.

- 1 Remove each filter by pulling the spring release handle (A) and then pulling down the filter.



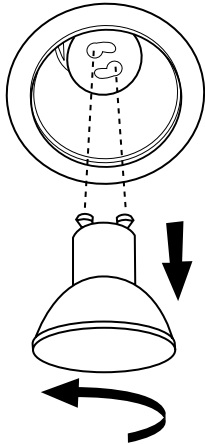
- 2 Wash metal filters as needed in dishwasher or hot detergent solution.
- 3 Reinstall the filter by making sure the spring release handles are toward the front. Insert metal grease filter into upper track.
- 4 Pull the spring release handle down.
- 5 Push up on metal filter and release handle to latch into place.
- 6 Repeat steps 1-5 for the other filter.

Replacing a LED lamp

Turn off the range hood and allow the LED lamp to cool. To avoid damage or decreasing the life of the new bulb, do not touch bulb with bare fingers. Replace bulb using tissue or wearing cotton gloves to handle bulb.

If new lamps do not operate, make sure the lamps are inserted correctly before calling service.

- 1 Disconnect power.
- 2 Push up on the lens and turn it counterclockwise.



- 3 Remove the bulb and replace it with a 120-volt, 6.5-watt maximum LED bulb with a GU10 base. Turn it clockwise to lock it into place.
- 4 Repeat steps 2-3 for the other bulb if needed.
- 5 Reconnect power.

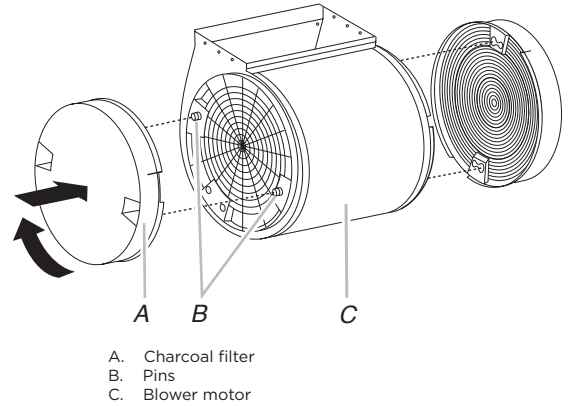

Recirculation kit - KIT02770

(for non-vented installations only)

The charcoal filters cannot be cleaned. It should be replaced every 4-6 months (depending on hood usage).

- 1 Cover the grill that protects the suction motor with the carbon filter so that the slots on the filter correspond to the pins on the sides of the motor protection grill.



- 2 Remove the cable ties in the carbon filter and turn the carbon filter clockwise to block them (bayonet fixing).
